RESUME EXECUTIF

In an international context marked by the growing complexity of development challenges, the effectiveness of policies and programs increasingly rests on the quality of governance, management and monitoring-and-evaluation systems. Despite the large volumes of financing mobilized worldwide, the results obtained often remain below expectations, owing to methodological weaknesses, insufficient coordination and a deficit of institutional capacities.

It is in response to these structural constraints that the World Association for Development (WAD) established the International Agency for the Management of the Development Dimension (IAMDD). This specialized entity positions itself as a strategic mechanism for supporting development governance, aimed at improving the quality of the planning, steering and evaluation of policies, programs and projects at the national and international levels.

IAMDD intervenes across the entire development value chain, from the design of interventions to the evaluation of their impacts. It mobilizes an integrated approach based on three main levers: strengthening institutional capacities, disseminating harmonized methodological standards, and integrating digital tools for management and monitoring-and-evaluation. This approach aims to guarantee the optimal use of resources, improve the traceability of results and strengthen the credibility of interventions among technical and financial partners.

The expected results of IAMDD are part of a logic of sustainable transformation of development-governance systems. They include in particular the establishment of an international management reference framework, the strengthening of actors' capacities, the deployment of an integrated digital monitoring-and-evaluation platform, and the improvement of the transparency, coordination and performance of interventions. These results contribute directly to achieving the Sustainable Development Goals, in particular SDG 16 on effective institutions and SDG 17 on partnerships.

IAMDD's activity plan rests on structuring axes covering the standardization of practices, capacity-building, the digitalization of management systems and the development of strategic partnerships. It translates into concrete deliverables, notably an international methodological reference framework, a digital steering platform, training and certification arrangements, and regular performance and impact reports.

The monitoring-and-evaluation mechanism is a central pillar of IAMDD's action. It rests on integrated systems for data collection and analysis, periodic reporting mechanisms and regular evaluations, making it possible to ensure results-based management, identify gaps and continuously improve interventions. This mechanism guarantees transparency, accountability and institutional learning.

Ultimately, IAMDD aspires to establish itself as a reference actor in development governance and management, providing a structured response to current challenges. It aims to transform mobilized resources into measurable and sustainable results, strengthen trust among stakeholders and contribute to the emergence of development systems that are more effective, inclusive and resilient.

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FOREWORD

The 21st century is characterized by the complexity of interdependencies and the acceleration of transformations reshaping global balances. In this shifting context, the success of development policies and programs cannot be guaranteed by the mobilization of financial resources alone; it depends above all on the quality of institutions, the relevance of methods and the rigor of the management mechanisms implemented. Where governance is weak and transparency insufficient, projects stall, resources are dissipated and results remain precarious.

In response to this observation, the World Association for Development (WAD) created the International Agency for the Management of the Development Dimension (IAMDD). This agency constitutes an institutional response to one of the most pressing challenges of our time: making governance and methodology no longer constraints, but strategic levers serving the effectiveness and sustainability of development actions.

IAMDD's vocation is to become a global reference center in the management of development policies and programs. It places at the heart of its mission the dissemination of international standards, the harmonization of practices and the promotion of innovative digital tools. By strengthening accountability and performance, it intends to restore the confidence of citizens, donors and partners in the capacity of projects to produce tangible and measurable impacts.

By aligning with the 2030 Agenda, IAMDD contributes directly to SDG 16 (effective and accountable institutions) and SDG 17 (global partnerships), while supporting, in a cross-cutting manner, the achievement of the other goals. It illustrates the conviction that governance is the keystone of all sustainable progress, and that transparency constitutes the first guarantee of justice and equity.

This framework document defines the foundations, orientations and mechanisms that will enable IAMDD to fully carry out its mission. It reflects WAD's determination to make management and governance not abstract notions, but concrete instruments of transformation in the service of peoples and future generations.

INTRODUCTION

The experience of recent decades has shown that the success of development initiatives lies not solely in the scale of the financing mobilized, but in the capacity to manage it with method, transparency and responsibility. Too often, the absence of solid monitoring-and-evaluation mechanisms, the lack of institutional coordination and the insufficiency of steering tools compromise the sustainability of results and weaken trust among partners.

It is to address this structural challenge that WAD established the International Agency for the Management of the Development Dimension (IAMDD). Designed as a strategic instrument, IAMDD's mandate is to promote high management standards, strengthen institutional capacities and equip development actors with methodological tools suited to contemporary challenges.

IAMDD intends to be both a methodological hub and an innovation platform. It offers logical frameworks, digital monitoring-and-evaluation systems and integrated approaches, in order to ensure the coherence of actions and the traceability of results. It fosters dialogue among donors, governments and civil society, and ensures that every mobilized resource translates into real impact for populations.

Beyond its technical role, IAMDD embodies a vision: that of development governed by rigor, enlightened by science and driven by transparency. It rests on the conviction that governance is not an end in itself, but the indispensable condition for transforming resources into prosperity, projects into results, and ambitions into tangible realities. Thus, this document introduces the foundations of IAMDD's action. It specifies its objectives, missions and instruments, and affirms its vocation to become a central actor in the global governance of development.



I. PRESENTATION OF THE INTERNATIONAL AGENCY FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE DEVELOPMENT DIMENSION (IAMDD)

IAMDD is WAD's specialized entity dedicated to governance engineering and the integrated steering of development policies, programs and projects. It aims to strengthen the quality of public decision-making, the performance of interventions and the mastery of management cycles.

Positioned as an international mechanism for strategic support, it intervenes across the entire value chain from planning to impact evaluation ensuring systematic alignment with the SDGs, international frameworks and national priorities.

It supports states, public institutions, international organizations, the private sector and civil society, mobilizing multidimensional expertise: strategic planning, programming, budget management, monitoring-and-evaluation, performance auditing and accountability. On the operational level, IAMDD promotes results-based management models, supported by advanced digital tools, and strengthens institutional capacities through the ownership of international standards.

Through its positioning, it acts as a lever for transforming development governance facilitating coordination, reducing information asymmetries and guaranteeing the traceability of resources. Its added value: combining methodological rigor, technological innovation and transparency, in the service of sustainable, inclusive and measurable development.

1.2. CONTEXT AND RATIONALE

The governance and management of development today constitute major challenges for the international community. While significant financial and technical resources are mobilized each year to finance projects and programs, the real impact on the ground often remains limited. Methodological weaknesses, insufficient coordination and the lack of rigorous monitoring-and-evaluation lead to the low effectiveness of many interventions, undermining donor confidence and the satisfaction of beneficiary populations.

Evaluations conducted by the World Bank, the OECD and UNDP show that the effectiveness of international aid and national programs is regularly hampered by the absence of coherent planning and governance frameworks. In several countries, projects struggle to achieve their objectives, for lack of reliable indicators, high-performing monitoring-and-evaluation systems and transparent accountability mechanisms. These gaps lead to a waste of resources and limit the sustainability of results. Globalization and the rapid evolution of contemporary challenges make a more integrated management of development indispensable. Climate change, the digital transition, social inequalities, economic instability and global health crises require states and institutions to revise their planning and steering methods. Development actors must be able to anticipate risks, allocate resources effectively and measure with precision the impacts generated.

In this context, the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) offer a universal reference framework. Yet recent United Nations reports indicate that fewer than 15% of the targets are on track to be achieved by 2030. One of the main reasons is the deficit of institutional and methodological capacities, which prevents the transformation of mobilized financing into tangible and sustainable results. This lag highlights the urgency of strengthening the governance and strategic management of development. The creation of the International Agency for the Management of the Development Dimension (IAMDD) responds to this requirement. It aims to fill the identified gaps by offering structured and specialized support, capable of assisting states, donors, the private sector and civil society in improving their planning, management and evaluation practices. By disseminating international standards and integrating methodological and digital innovations, IAMDD positions itself as an essential actor in the strategic steering of development.

Through its mandate, IAMDD aspires to strengthen the performance, accountability and transparency of public policies and development initiatives. It provides unique added value by guaranteeing that every mobilized resource is used optimally, that results are measured with rigor, and that actions are fully aligned with the priorities of the 2030 Agenda. Its role is to transform current challenges into opportunities for sustainable and inclusive progress for all societies.



1.3. INTEGRATED CONCEPT NOTE

The creation of the International Agency for the Management of the Development Dimension (IAMDD) is part of a dynamic of response to the structural weaknesses that limit the effectiveness of development policies and programs. Too often, the resources mobilized by states, donors and international institutions do not reach their objectives for lack of solid planning, management and monitoring-and-evaluation mechanisms. This deficit compromises the sustainability of results and weakens trust between partners and beneficiaries.

IAMDD's intervention hypothesis rests on the idea that sustainable and inclusive development can only be achieved through rigorous governance and transparent management of mobilized resources. The agency intends to be a global catalyst, capable of providing methodological, institutional and technical expertise at all levels: from design to execution, through to the monitoring and evaluation of projects and programs.

IAMDD's approach combines three complementary dimensions: the strengthening of human and institutional capacities, the dissemination and harmonization of international results-based management standards, and the integration of digital steering and evaluation tools. This integrated approach aims to transform available resources into measurable impacts, increase the effectiveness of aid and foster better coordination among the various development actors.

1.4. EXPECTED RESULTS

The interventions of the International Agency for the Management of the Development Dimension (IAMDD) aim to produce structural changes in the way development policies and programs are designed, steered and evaluated. The expected results are part of a logic of sustainable transformation of governance and management systems.

In the medium and long term, IAMDD aspires to contribute to the emergence of a harmonized international reference framework in development governance and management, making it possible to ensure the coherence of interventions and their alignment with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

On the operational level, the expected results are as follows:

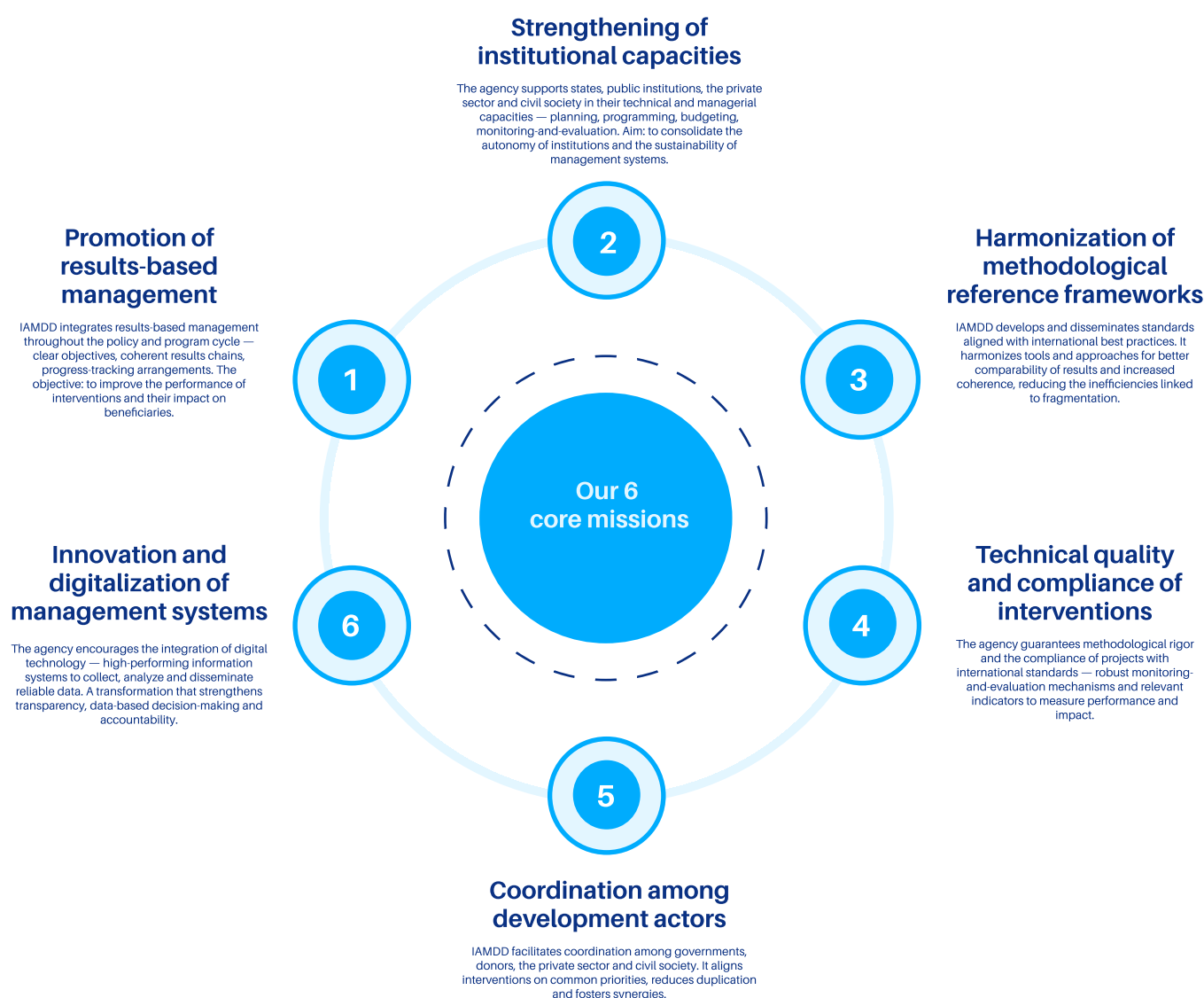
- Establishment and progressive adoption of an **international methodological reference framework** integrating standards of planning, results-based management, monitoring-and-evaluation and accountability, recognized by states and technical and financial partners.
- **Structuring of a portfolio of projects and programs** compliant with IAMDD standards, characterized by improved design quality, increased traceability of resources and a strengthened capacity to measure impacts.
- **Significant strengthening of the institutional and organizational capacities** of public administrations, private organizations and civil-society actors, notably in strategic planning, budget management and monitoring-and-evaluation.
- **Deployment of an integrated digital infrastructure** dedicated to development steering, enabling the real-time collection, analysis and dissemination of performance data, and facilitating evidence-based decision-making.

II. MISSIONS AND FUNCTIONS

The International Agency for the Management of the Development Dimension (IAMDD) has the vocation of strengthening the quality of development-governance systems by structuring the planning, steering and evaluation capacities of public policies and development initiatives. As such, it acts as a strategic lever aimed at guaranteeing that mobilized resources produce measurable, sustainable results aligned with the priorities of the 2030 Agenda.

2.1. CORE MISSIONS

The International Agency for the Management of the Development Dimension (IAMDD) operates according to 6 missions:



2.2. OPERATIONAL FUNCTIONS

In order to translate its strategic orientations into concrete actions, IAMDD relies on a set of structured operational functions covering the entire management cycle of development policies and programs. They make it possible to articulate the strategic, technical and operational dimensions, in a logic of effectiveness, accountability and continuous improvement.

Design of strategic steering tools

- IAMDD develops and adapts instruments such as logical frameworks, theories of change and performance-indicator systems. These tools are contextualized according to national and sectoral realities, in order to guarantee their relevance and effectiveness in steering policies and programs.

Deployment of integrated monitoring-and-evaluation systems

- The agency establishes structured monitoring-and-evaluation arrangements, often supported by digital platforms. It assists institutions in the ownership of these tools, ensuring that they are used regularly and effectively to guide decisions and improve performance.

Technical support across the entire project cycle

- IAMDD provides specialized technical assistance covering all phases of the life cycle of projects and programs, from identification and formulation through to final evaluation. This support aims to secure processes, improve the quality of interventions and maximize their impact.

Implementation of capacity-building programs

- The agency organizes training courses, workshops and certification arrangements for development decision-makers, managers and practitioners. These programs aim to disseminate good practices, strengthen technical skills and professionalize the actors involved in development management.

Production and dissemination of strategic knowledge

- IAMDD produces performance reports, impact evaluations and strategic analyses intended to inform decision-making. It thus helps to strengthen transparency, improve accountability and support institutional learning.

Strategic intelligence and methodological innovation

- The agency ensures continuous monitoring of international developments in governance, development management and innovation. It integrates these developments into its approaches and tools, in order to maintain a high level of standards and adapt its interventions to emerging challenges.

III. ORGANIZATION & GOVERNANCE

The International Agency for the Management of the Development Dimension (IAMDD) rests on an institutional architecture designed to guarantee the strategic coherence, methodological rigor and operational performance of its interventions. Its organization aims to ensure an effective articulation between the functions of steering, expertise and implementation, while respecting the principles of transparency, accountability and integrity.

This structuring makes it possible to secure decision-making processes, strengthen the technical quality of interventions and guarantee rigorous monitoring of results, in compliance with the requirements of technical and financial partners.

3.1. MANAGEMENT AND COORDINATION

- **General management**

IAMDD is placed under the authority of a Director General, appointed by WAD, responsible for ensuring the strategic leadership of the agency. He/she defines the operational orientations, oversees their implementation and guarantees the alignment of activities with institutional priorities and international frameworks. He/she represents the agency with partners and ensures the mobilization of the resources needed for its functioning.

- **Internal coordination**

Management relies on technical, administrative and educational units organized functionally. This coordination ensures the smoothness of operations, the coherence of programs and effectiveness in resource management.

- **Articulation with WAD**

IAMDD maintains a close functional link with the other components of WAD, notably the global programs, observatories and support structures. This articulation guarantees the complementarity of interventions, avoids duplication and strengthens the overall coherence of institutional action.



3.2. GOVERNANCE BODIES

- **International strategic committee**

The Strategic Committee constitutes IAMDD's orientation and supervision body. It defines priorities, validates the broad orientations and ensures the alignment of interventions with the 2030 Agenda and international frameworks. It also plays a role in monitoring overall performance and in strategic arbitration.

- **Scientific and technical council**

Composed of recognized experts in the fields of governance, monitoring-and-evaluation, public management and innovation, this council guarantees the methodological quality of the tools and approaches developed by the agency. It ensures a function of technical validation, scientific monitoring and continuous improvement.

- **Specialized operational units**

These units ensure the implementation of IAMDD's activities in its various areas of intervention. They are responsible for the design, deployment and monitoring of tools and services, ensuring compliance with methodological standards and performance requirements.

3.3. GOVERNANCE PRINCIPLES

IAMDD's organization and functioning rest on a set of structuring principles:



TRANSPARENCY

The agency guarantees the traceability of decisions, processes and mobilized resources, ensuring clear access to information for stakeholders.



ACCOUNTABILITY

It reports on its actions and results to donors, partners and beneficiaries, in a logic of shared responsibility.



INTEGRITY

It applies high ethical standards, based on honesty, rigor and respect for professional rules.



PARTICIPATION

It fosters the involvement of concerned actors in decision-making, implementation and evaluation processes.



PERFORMANCE

It operates within a logic of measurable results, seeking the effectiveness, efficiency and sustainability of interventions.

3.4. OPERATING ARRANGEMENTS

IAMDD's operating arrangements define the operational framework through which the agency implements its missions and ensures the coherence of its interventions. They specify the administrative, financial, technical and organizational mechanisms mobilized to guarantee rigorous, transparent and results-oriented management. By structuring the processes of coordination, monitoring, control and evaluation, these arrangements aim to strengthen the effectiveness of actions, secure the use of resources and ensure continuous accountability toward partners and beneficiaries. The agency ensures the traceability of decisions and resources, guaranteeing clear access to information for stakeholders.

- **Administrative and financial framework**

IAMDD relies on a structured arrangement, compliant with international standards, integrating formalized procedures for budget planning, financial execution and internal control. Internal and external audit mechanisms ensure transparency, the traceability of resources and compliance with the standards in force.

- **Coordination and reporting mechanisms**

Regular internal and external coordination arrangements are implemented, supported by periodic steering meetings and standardized reporting systems. These tools make it possible to track the progress of programs and report to partners and public authorities

- **Information systems and digital tools**

IAMDD mobilizes integrated digital platforms for the collection, processing and analysis of data from its interventions, facilitating real-time monitoring and evidence-based decision-making.

- **Evaluation and continuous-improvement arrangements**

Regular evaluations of the effectiveness, efficiency and impact of interventions make it possible to adjust strategies and optimize practices. This approach is part of a logic of continuous learning and progressive improvement of management systems.



IV. ACTIVITY PLAN

IAMDD's activity plan translates its strategic orientations into concrete actions, organized around priority axes aimed at strengthening development governance and the performance of management systems.

It rests on a logic of results-based management, combining methodological standardization, capacity-building, technological innovation and the development of partnerships to guarantee coherence between objectives, actions and expected impacts.

4.1. OPERATIONAL OBJECTIVES

IAMDD's operational objectives structure its action in the field and orient the mobilization of resources, partnerships and intervention capacities.

Improving the quality of planning and implementation processes

- IAMDD aims to strengthen methodological rigor in the design and execution of development policies and programs. This objective translates into the introduction of standardized tools, the improvement of planning frameworks and the support of institutions in adopting practices aligned with international standards.

Strengthening transparency and coherence in the management of interventions

- The agency works to guarantee the traceability of resources and the coherence of actions, by establishing harmonized monitoring and reporting mechanisms. This approach aims to reduce inefficiencies, limit duplication and improve the readability of interventions for all stakeholders.

Promoting digitalization and data-based management

- IAMDD supports the integration of digital solutions into development-management systems, in order to facilitate the collection, analysis and exploitation of data. This transformation aims to improve decision-making and strengthen institutions' capacity to steer their interventions proactively.

Sustainable development of institutional capacities

- The agency helps strengthen the technical and organizational skills of development actors, fostering continuous learning and the professionalization of management practices.

4.2. PRIORITY AREAS OF INTERVENTION

The operational objectives are translated into structuring areas of intervention, which organize IAMDD's activities and ensure the coherence of the actions carried out.

- **Structuring and dissemination of methodological reference frameworks**

This area aims to develop and harmonize development-management tools, notably logical frameworks, theories of change and indicator systems. IAMDD works on the standardization of practices in order to ensure better comparability of results and increased coherence among interventions.

- **Capacity-building and professionalization of actors**

The agency implements training programs, technical workshops and certification arrangements aimed at improving the skills of decision-makers and managers. This area aims to strengthen the autonomy of institutions and improve the overall quality of development management.

- **Deployment of digital solutions and information systems**

IAMDD develops and implements digital platforms dedicated to monitoring-and-evaluation and data management. These tools enable real-time performance monitoring, facilitate transparency and strengthen decision-making based on reliable data.

- **Development of cooperation and partnerships**

This area aims to strengthen collaboration mechanisms among governments, donors, international organizations and non-state actors. It helps improve coordination, mobilize complementary resources and maximize the impact of interventions.

4.3. EXPECTED DELIVERABLES

IAMDD's expected deliverables are the concrete products resulting from its activity plan. They translate its strategic orientations into tools, reference frameworks and structuring arrangements intended for states and partners. Designed in a logic of performance and accountability, they aim to improve the quality of planning, the management of interventions and the measurement of results — while constituting tangible elements for assessing the agency's action and impact.



01

Development and adoption of an international development-management reference framework

A structured methodological framework integrating international standards (planning, results-based management, monitoring-and-evaluation, accountability). A common basis for states and partners, regularly updated to harmonize practices and compare performance.

02

Establishment of an integrated digital steering and monitoring-and-evaluation platform

A digital infrastructure for the collection, processing and analysis of data, with real-time monitoring, performance visualization and automated reporting. It strengthens transparency, the traceability of resources and decision-making based on reliable data.

03

Development of a structured training and certification arrangement

An integrated capacity-building program — training modules, technical workshops and certification pathways suited to decision-makers, managers and practitioners. It professionalizes practices and strengthens the autonomy of institutions.

04

Production of consolidated performance, evaluation and impact reports

Regular analytical reports on performance, the achievement of results and impacts, intended for donors, governments and stakeholders. They feed institutional learning and guide strategic decisions.

05

Building of a portfolio of projects and programs compliant with IAMDD standards

A reference base of initiatives compliant with the agency's methodological requirements, illustrating high-performing and replicable management models. It strengthens the credibility of interventions and facilitates the mobilization of financing.

06

Development of sectoral methodological tools and guides

Practical guides, technical manuals and operational tools suited to each development sector, offering actors concrete reference frameworks that take sectoral and national specificities into account.



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V. MONITORING AND EVALUATION

IAMDD's monitoring-and-evaluation mechanism constitutes an integrated steering mechanism aimed at ensuring the continuous measurement of performance, strengthening accountability and supporting evidence-based decision-making. It makes it possible to ensure the traceability of interventions, identify gaps relative to objectives and evaluate the real effects of the actions carried out, in a logic of continuous improvement.

5.1. COLLECTION, MANAGEMENT AND ANALYSIS OF PERFORMANCE DATA

The collection, management, and analysis of data constitute the foundation of the AIGDD's monitoring and evaluation system. The agency implements structured mechanisms that allow for the regular, harmonized, and secure gathering of information relating to the implementation of development policies, programs, and projects. These data are consolidated through integrated information systems that ensure their quality, reliability, and availability, in order to effectively support steering and decision-making processes.

The use of the collected data makes it possible to produce strategic and operational analyses intended to measure the progress achieved, identify gaps with respect to the established objectives, and anticipate the risks likely to affect the performance of interventions. By promoting evidence-based management, this system strengthens transparency, improves the accountability of stakeholders, and contributes to the continuous optimization of development results and impacts.

5.2. OPERATIONAL MONITORING AND PERIODIC REPORTING

Periodic reports are produced to track the evolution of activities, measure the achievement of objectives and identify gaps. This reporting makes it possible to ensure transparent communication with partners and to facilitate decision-making.

- **Use of steering tools and dashboards**

IAMDD mobilizes interactive dashboards and information systems making it possible to visualize key indicators and track the evolution of performance. These tools facilitate decision-making, make it possible to anticipate risks and help improve the effectiveness of intervention steering.

- **Organization of responsibilities and coordination of the mechanism**

Monitoring and evaluation are ensured by IAMDD's operational units, in coordination with institutional partners. This organization guarantees a regular flow of information, the accountability of actors and better coherence in data management and analysis.

- **Conduct of periodic and independent evaluations**

Intermediate and final evaluations are carried out to assess the relevance, effectiveness, efficiency, impact and sustainability of interventions. Where necessary, external evaluations are carried out by independent experts, in order to guarantee the objectivity and credibility of results.

- **Analysis of the impacts and sustainability of interventions**

The mechanism makes it possible to evaluate the medium- and long-term effects of the actions implemented, by analyzing their contribution to structural transformations and their capacity to produce sustainable results. This analysis is essential for assessing the real added value of interventions.

- **Capitalization of gains and institutional learning**

The lessons drawn from monitoring and evaluations are systematically integrated into planning and management processes. This approach fosters the continuous improvement of practices, the strengthening of capacities and the adaptation of strategies to observed realities.

- **Dissemination of results and strengthening of accountability**

The results of monitoring and evaluations are shared with all stakeholders, notably states, donors and technical partners. This dissemination helps strengthen transparency, improve coordination and guarantee the optimal use of resources.



VI. CONCLUSION

Ultimately, the International Agency for the Management of the Development Dimension constitutes a major strategic instrument of WAD for strengthening the quality, coherence and accountability of development interventions. By placing planning, monitoring-and-evaluation, results-based management and transparency at the center of its action, IAMDD responds to an essential requirement: transforming mobilized resources into verifiable, sustainable results useful to populations.

Its institutional positioning enables it to act as a lever for improving governance systems, by supporting states, international organizations, technical and financial partners, the private sector and civil society. Through its methodological reference frameworks, its digital tools, its training arrangements and its evaluation mechanisms, IAMDD helps reduce inefficiencies, strengthen the coordination of actors and improve the credibility of development policies and programs. This, IAMDD is fully part of WAD's vision of development that is better organized, more transparent and more oriented toward impact. Its contribution to the SDGs, notably the goals relating to effective institutions, accountability and partnerships, makes it a central structure for supporting the institutional transformations necessary for inclusive, measurable and sustainable development.



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
